#### A MESSAGE FROM UNITED GRAD WORKERS

It's official: on January 4, 2022, the New Mexico Public Employee Labor Relations Board certified our union! The PELRB joins us in demanding that UNM quit stalling and bargain a fair contract for grad workers. This guarantees us certain rights per the Public Employee Bargaining Act, including the right to have a steward present in any conversation you believe could lead to discipline, and UNM cannot make any unilateral changes to our contracts without negotiation with our union. If you are concerned about something happening in your department, please fill out this grievance form. Now that we've been certified, it is more important than ever to join your union to exercise your voice over your working conditions - sign a card and take the bargaining survey, and encourage your colleagues to do the same! To learn more about our certification, your rights under PEBA, and our plan to get UNM to sit down with us at the bargaining table this semester, attend our General Membership Meeting on Thursday, January 20, at 5:30pm.

THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO HAS UPDATED ITS COVID ADMINISTRATIVE VACCINE MANDATE AND WILL NOW REQUIRE A BOOSTER SHOT REQUIREMENT AS PART OF ITS MANDATE. THE REQUIREMENT APPLIES TO ALL CURRENT EMPLOYEES AND STUDENTS TO RECEIVE A BOOSTER DOSE OF THE VACCINE WHEN ELIGIBLE ACCORDING TO THE FDA.

INDIVIDUALS WHO RECEIVED THEIR SECOND DOSE OF AN MRNA VACCINE (PFIZER OR MODERNA) ON OR BEFORE JUNE 15, 2021, OR THEIR SINGLE DOSE OF A VIRAL VECTOR VACCINE (JOHNSON & JOHNSON) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 15, 2021, MUST PROVIDE DOCUMENTATION OF RECEIPT OF A BOOSTER DOSE NO LATER THAN JANUARY 17, 2022.

#### Chicana Feminisms (CCS 336/536)

Instructor: Dr. Elizabeth González Cárdenas Tuesdays 4:00-6:30 p.m. Face-to-Face Spring 2022

This course will provide students with the diverse experiences and perspectives of Chicanas in the United States and explores the development of Chicana Feminisms. Special attention is given to issues of race, class, gender, sexuality, education, testimonios, media representation, religion/spirituality, labor, and political engagement. Students will explore the historical development of Chicana Feminisms by focusing on the different waves of feminism and how Chicana Feminists differ from European and U.S. Feminist Movements. This class also pays attention to the contributions of New Mexican women to Chicana Feminist efforts.

#### Chicanas and Chicanos in Education CCS 455/555 Spring 2022

Wednesday 4:00-6:30 p.m. Face-to-Face Instructor: Dr. Elizabeth González Cárdenas

This course provides an overview of Chicana Chicano educational experiences within the United States school system. Students will analyze historical and institutional developments that shape the educational experiences of Chicanas and Chicanos. The course also explores the theoretical and material dimensions of education with an emphasis on topics such as segregation, tracking, policy, college access, immigration, race, gender and sexuality. Overall, this course illustrates the historical, social, political, and economic forces that impact Chicana and Chicano educational experiences.



#### OUR TEAM IS HERE TO SUPPORT YOU ANY WAY THAT WE CAN! READ OUR FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Why do I have GPSA charge on my bursar's account? Students enrolled in a degree-seeking graduate program at UNM are required to pay a student fee to GPSA. This fee goes to funding UNM programs and organizations and is allocated annually by the Student Fee Review Board. Students who do not pay this fee are not eligible to apply for scholarships or grants through GPSA.

Are new UNM Graduate & Professional Students eligible to apply for grants? Yes. You are eligible to apply for SRG, PDG and NMRG (if being offered in the semester) if you meet the respective grant's requirement. However, you are not eligible to apply for the Graduate Scholarship Fund (GSF) if you are in your first semester.

## WANT TO LEARN MORE ABOUT GPSA?

Are grants and scholarships offered every semester? The Student Research Grant (SRG), Professional Development Grant (PDG) and Graduate Scholarship Fund (GSF) are offered in every semester i.e. Fall, Spring and Summer. However, the New Mexico Research Grant (NMRG High Priority and General Priority) are offered only in the Fall Semester.

**Can I apply to multiple grants in one grant cycle?** Yes, you can apply multiple grants in the same grant cycle, but each grant requires a separate application i.e. Statement of Proposal, Budget sheet and Letter of Recommendation (if required).

Can I utilize my grant award another semester? Yes, you can. The funds which are sought for the event or activity must be utilized within the next, current or previous funding period.
