She is investigating alternative approaches to sensitize resistant cancer cells.

UNM HEALTH SCIENCES STUDENT GRANT

- Creation of a new grant housed under GPSA's grant cycle that benefits Health Sciences Students. The goal is to fund Health Sciences Students in their clinical rotations around rural NM and increase the ability of students to serve the people of NM.
- TOTAL ASK: ONE-TIME AMOUNT OF \$50,000

UNM NEW MEXICO RESEARCH GRANT

- Match funding for a grant currently housed under GPSA's grant cycle. The goal is to double the funding available for students that are conducting research and doing work that benefits NM and its people.

A MESSAGE FROM UNITED GRAD WORKERS

In spite of our union's certification on January 4th by the Public Employee Labor Relations Board, UNM admin continue to ignore our calls for them to bargain a new contract. Our elected bargaining committee sent a formal request to begin negotiations on January 10th and we are now inviting everyone (graduate workers along with our students, families, friends, and community supporters) to add their voices by sending an <u>Action Network letter</u>. UNM admin must stop their stalling and stop wasting taxpayer dollars on a third-party law firm that has yet to succeed in busting our union. We also encourage you (and your friends and family!) to <u>write a physical letter</u> and post a picture of yourself with your letter on Twitter and/or Instagram (tag @unmgradworkers). And finally: today, January 26th, at 12pm, we are holding a <u>Community Demand to Bargain Rally and March</u> between Mesa Vista Hall and the SUB. The bigger and more participatory our union is, the stronger we will be at the bargaining table - <u>sign a card</u> and <u>take the bargaining survey</u>, and encourage your colleagues to do the same!

THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO HAS UPDATED ITS COVID ADMINISTRATIVE VACCINE MANDATE AND WILL NOW REQUIRE A BOOSTER SHOT REQUIREMENT AS PART OF ITS MANDATE. THE REQUIREMENT APPLIES TO ALL CURRENT EMPLOYEES AND STUDENTS TO RECEIVE A BOOSTER DOSE OF THE VACCINE WHEN ELIGIBLE ACCORDING TO THE FDA.



Why do I have GPSA charge on my bursar's account? Students enrolled in a degree-seeking graduate program at UNM are required to pay a student fee to GPSA. This fee goes to funding UNM programs and organizations and is allocated annually by the Student Fee Review Board. Students who do not pay this fee are not eligible to apply for scholarships or grants through GPSA.

Are new UNM Graduate & Professional Students eligible to apply for grants? Yes. You are eligible to apply for SRG, PDG and NMRG (if being offered in the semester) if you meet the respective grant's requirement. However, you are not eligible to apply for the Graduate Scholarship Fund (GSF) if you are in your first semester.

Are grants and scholarships offered every semester? The Student Research Grant (SRG), Professional Development Grant (PDG) and Graduate Scholarship Fund (GSF) are offered in every semester i.e. Fall, Spring and Summer. However, the New Mexico Research Grant (NMRG High Priority and General Priority) are offered only in the Fall Semester.

Can I apply to multiple grants in one grant cycle? Yes, you can apply multiple grants in the same grant cycle, but each grant requires a separate application i.e. Statement of Proposal, Budget sheet and Letter of Recommendation (if required).

Can I utilize my grant award another semester? Yes, you can. The funds which are sought for the event or activity must be utilized within the next, current or previous funding period.
