WHEREAS, the number of graduate students UNM serves is about 5,489 as of the 26

Spring 2025 semester²; and 27

WHEREAS, the number of Hispanic students UNM serves is 11,847 as of the 28

Spring 2025 semester³; and 29

WHEREAS, the number of International students UNM serves is 1,088 as of the 30

Spring 2025 semester⁴; and 31

WHEREAS, the number of students identifying as American Indian that UNM 32

- WHEREAS, the number of Black/African American students UNM serves is 652⁶;
- 35 and
- WHEREAS, the number of Asian students UNM serves is 980⁷; and
- WHEREAS, the number of students who identify as two or more ethnicities/races
- that UNM serves is 9638; and
- 39 WHEREAS, on January 21, 2025, President Trump issued an executive order
- 40 titled "Ending Illegal Discrimination and Restoring Merit-Based Opportunity"
- 41 (EO 14173) with the aim of ending so-called "Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion"
- 42 ("DEI") policies within, amongst other places, higher education⁹; and
- WHEREAS, EO 14173 instructs US federal agencies to investigate and "combat"
- these DEI programs¹⁰; and
- WHEREAS, EO 14173 instructs the Secretary of Education to issue guidance to
- state educational agencies who receive educational funds, grants, or participate in
- 47 the federal student loan assistance program to "comply" with their established
- measures and practices under the relevant statues and case law¹¹; and
- WHEREAS, the Department of Education issued guidance, popularly known as
- the "Dear Colleague" letter, suggesting that the Supreme Court Decision in
- 51 Students for Fair Admissions (SFFA) v. Harvard, where the use of race in school
- admissions was held to be unlawful, is also applicable in other settings, such as in
- diversity, equity, and inclusion efforts undertaken by colleges and universities¹²:

- WHEREAS, the Department of Education has threatened institutions with loss of
- funding for failure to comply with the issued guidance; and
- 57 WHEREAS, EO 14173 requires such institutions receiving funds to certify not to
- operate programs that promote DEI; and
- 59 WHEREAS, The US District Court for the District of Maryland granted a
- preliminary injunction against EO 14173, alongside the similar Executive Order
- 61 14151, because the order's use of words and phrases like "DEI," "equity-related,"

64 65 66	WHEREAS, The Federal Appeals Court for the Fourth Circuit lifted the injunction pending appeal, but only on the basis that the injunction was improper and not on the basis that the Executive Order is lawful; and
67 68 69 70 71 72	WHEREAS, on January 20, 2025, President Trump also issued an Executive Order titled "Protecting the United States from Foreign Terrorists and Other National Security and Public Safety Threats" (EO 14161), which calls for tighter checks on visa applications for any sign of "hostile attitudes towards its [the United States'] citizens, culture, government, institutions, or founding principles" and
73 74 75 76	WHEREAS, the Trump administration has targeted and revoked the visas of international students across the country for minor infractions that in no way call into question their "attitude" towards the United States or its people and institutions ¹⁴ ; and
77 78	WHEREAS, at New Mexico State University, nine students have had their student visas revoked as of April 12, 2025 ¹⁵ ; and
79 80	WHEREAS, at New Mexico Tech, one student has had their student visa revoked as of April 9. 2025 ¹⁶
81 82	WHEREAS, at UNM, an unspecified number of students have had their student visas revoked as of April 9, 2025 ¹⁷ ; and
83 84	WHEREAS, the Trump administration has increased efforts to deport and detain undocumented immigrants in the United States ¹⁸ ; and

WHEREAS, UNM has purported to be a university that provides a "safe

environment and supportive community..." to undocumented students¹⁹; and

87 88	WHEREAS, UNM serves a sizable undocumented community through providing higher education and other services such as healthcare and employment; and
89 90	WHEREAS, UNM advances through the work of international students, especially graduate teaching and research assistants; and
91 92	WHEREAS, UNM is one of 600 schools to be a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI) ²⁰ ; and
93 94	WHEREAS, the title of HSI comes with the responsibility of serving Hispanic students, which is a "diverse" group within the United States; and
95 96	WHEREAS, the Hispanic population also includes undocumented immigrants; and
97 98 99 100	WHEREAS, Goal Three of UNM's 2040 Strategic Framework is to strive for "Inclusive Excellence" by "Utilize[ing] an equity and inclusion lens to expand opportunity" and through strengthening UNM's equity and inclusion infrastructure ²¹ ; and
101 102	WHEREAS, as part of strengthening UNM's equity and inclusion infrastructure, involves standing up against efforts which aim to dismantle said efforts; and
103 104 105	WHEREAS, Goal One of UNM 2040 is to Advance New Mexico through "Understand[ing] the needs and unique opportunities of our distinct New Mexican cultures" ²² ; and
106 107 108	WHEREAS, in understanding the needs and unique opportunities of New Mexico's distinct cultures, institutions have to stand against attacks on diversity, equity, and inclusion efforts; and
109 110 111	WHEREAS, UNM is considering revising its policies, especially around equal opportunity and prohibited discrimination as it applies to its educational and work environments ²³ ;
112 113 114 115	THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED, that GPSA condemns the Trump administration's efforts to eliminate programs aimed at increasing diversity, equity, and inclusion at institutions of higher education and elsewhere in American society; and

120 121 122 123	THEREFORE LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that GPSA stands in support of undocumented students at UNM who have not committed any major infractions which warrant deportation and for them to be free from fear of deportation and to be free to pursue their education; and
124 125 126	THEREFORE LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that GPSA supports international students at UNM in completing their studies without fear having their student visas being revoked without just cause; and
127 128 129 130	THEREFORE LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that GPSA calls upon UNM, as part of UNM 2040, to assert its interest in upholding diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives aimed at furthering UNM's goal of having a diverse student body, faculty, and staff; and
131 132 133	THEREFORE LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that GPSA calls upon UNM to protect all students, especially undocumented students and international students, from having their due process rights from being curtailed by the federal government.
