

OPPORTUNITY TO PARTICIPATE IN RESEARCH STUDY

Dear Colleagues,

We are conducting a research study (Dismantling Constructs of Whiteness in Higher Education: Narratives of Resistance from the Academy— IRB# 15221) to investigate the lived experiences of racialized adult men and adult women of color working in various academic institutions using qualitative research methods.

You are receiving this information because you may meet the criteria as follows:

- Adult men and women who self-identify as Black or African American, employed as faculty and/or staff at the University of New Mexico.

The purpose of this research study is to collect qualitative data from adult men and adult women who self-identify as Black or African American about their experiences in higher education.

If you agree to participate, this study will involve one 90-minute individual session. The sessions will be conducted via Zoom or Microsoft® Teams and recorded and transcribed analyzed for themes. You will be assigned a pseudonym and composite narratives will be developed to maintain confidentiality as each population targeted are small groups and maybe known to the researchers.

Risks may include the risk of breach of confidentiality, the risk of feeling uncomfortable responding to assessments and surveys, and the risk of feeling uncomfortable participating in a research study. The researchers will act in an ethical manner, protect participant data, and adhere to IRB research protocol and standards. The researchers are trained in best practices and regulations pertaining to consent. Participants will have opportunity to drop out of the study at any time and for any reason.

OPPORTUNITY TO PARTICIPATE IN RESEARCH STUDY CONTINUED

There may not be any direct benefit to you for participating but it is hoped that participation will contribute to the advancement of issues critical to the achievement of a more diverse higher education system in the United States. There are long term benefits to study participants in that the overall goal is to identify and address issues related to the experiences of faculty and staff of color on university campuses. The long-term societal benefit is that we are contributing to the conversation about ameliorating impacts of the lack of diversity of people and self-awareness of the dominant narrative on college and university campuses in departments, administratively, in the classrooms, and in other spaces like libraries and labs. The national conversation on the experiences of faculty of color is growing and this work will add to that corpus.

You will not be compensated for participating in this project.

You do not have to be in this study, your decision to be in any study is totally voluntary.

A MESSAGE ON BEHALF OF THE CHIEF INFORMATION OFFICER

In response to global trends and other emerging threats related to information security, President Stokes has asked UNM IT to make a focused effort on accelerating improvements to our security controls in 2021-2022 (President's Message, 7/26/21 and 11/8/21). The first update, based on industry best practices, enhances the safeguards protecting LoboMail accounts by using Sender Policy Framework (SPF)* to help prevent email address spoofing.

NOTE: These changes apply only to UNM LoboMail (unm.edu) users. These changes will not be made to the security controls for HSC accounts or other email accounts that are not managed by UNM IT.

What does this mean for you?

Beginning 11/29/2021, to further protect LoboMail users, emails that are likely to be a result of spoofing will be quarantined. Spoofing is where the "From" address does not match the originating email system. While this approach has been proven to be very effective at protecting against malicious emails, it can result in the quarantining of legitimate messages. When an email is quarantined, instead of receiving the original message, you will receive a message telling you that this email is quarantined.

Please see FastInfo 7900 for detailed information on addressing email quarantine notices. If you believe the email was sent to you by a legitimate sender, please contact UNM IT Customer Support Services at 277-5757 to request the release of the email for delivery to your Inbox. Hours of operation are Monday - Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Due to the healthcare nature of the Health Sciences Center, there are variations to services and support for HSC students, faculty, and staff. If you have questions regarding HSC technology services, please contact the HSC Service Desk at 272-1694 or HSC-CIO-notices@salud.unm.edu.

* Sender Policy Framework (SPF) is an Internet standard protocol (RFC 7208) recommended by the Internet Engineering Task Force to help prevent spoofing by using "From" addresses to determine if an email came from a source approved by the sender's domain. The receiving email system then processes the email based on the SPF information returned by that domain.



OUR TEAM IS HERE TO SUPPORT YOU ANY WAY THAT WE CAN! READ OUR FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Why do I have GPSA charge on my bursar's account? Students enrolled in a degree-seeking graduate program at UNM are required to pay a student fee to GPSA. This fee goes to funding UNM programs and organizations and is allocated annually by the Student Fee Review Board. Students who do not pay this fee are not eligible to apply for scholarships or grants through GPSA.

Are new UNM Graduate & Professional Students eligible to apply for grants? Yes. You are eligible to apply for SRG, PDG and NMRC (if being offered in the semester) if you meet the respective grant's requirement. However, you are not eligible to apply for the Graduate Scholarship Fund (GSF) if you are in your first semester.

WANT TO LEARN MORE ABOUT GPSA? CONTINUED

Are grants and scholarships offered every semester? The Student Research Grant (SRG), Professional Development Grant (PDG) and Graduate Scholarship Fund (GSF) are offered in every semester i.e. Fall, Spring and Summer. However, the New Mexico Research Grant (NMRC High Priority and General Priority) are offered only in the Fall Semester.

Can I apply to multiple grants in one grant cycle? Yes, you can apply multiple grants in the same grant cycle, but each grant requires a separate application i.e. Statement of Proposal, Budget sheet and Letter of Recommendation (if required).

Can I utilize my grant award another semester? Yes, you can. The funds which are sought for the event or activity must be utilized within the next, current or previous funding period.
