

General Council Meeting Minutes 22 February, 2025 Sub Lobo A&B

- 1) Call to order at 10.05 am.
 - a) Roll call

All the representatives except those from communications, electrical engineering, and Native American studies were present.

- a) Adoption of agenda
 - The motion to adopt the agenda for the meeting was proposed, seconded, and passed unanimously.
 - The indigenous peoples' land and territory acknowledgement and the statement acknowledging the labor and sacrifices of Black Americans were read out.

2) Opening business

- a) The Chair opened the minutes of the previous meeting to discussion. There were no questions or discussion points, and the minutes were approved unanimously.
- b) First graduate social program happening on Tuesday 25th at 8.30 am was announced.
- c) The representative from economics raised a point about representatives speaking in their capacity as reps or executive /legislative council members.

3) Guest Speakers

- 1. Travis Broadhurst
 - a) Travis Broadhurst introduced himself as a PhD candidate in civil engineering and presidential candidate for GPSA
 - b) He outlined his experience, passion for GPSA, and reasons for running for president.
 - c) He discussed his goals, including increased collaboration with the Graduate Workers Union and more events hosted by GPSA.
 - d) Travis also mentioned his ideas for expanding the laptop loaner program and sponsoring dental clinic visits for graduate students.
 - e) The possibility of expanding the laptop loaner program and sponsoring the dental clinic visits for students were mentioned as well.

- 4) Officer Reports
 - a) The President announced the passage of HB 89 and SB 68 in the New Mexico legislature.
 - b) Elections for the new administration would take place in the first week of March.

5) Committee Reports

- a) Grants director provided updates on the spring grant cycle, including the review process and the number of awards expected.
- b) Boards and Committee director stated the University has chosen to pursue an equitable access policy and program for undergrads to get their textbooks and a major campus IT outage.

6) Council Member Reports

- a) Department of Biology was organizing a dunk tank event for fundraising.
- b) EPS reported on their graduate research symposium
- c) Department of Economics was piloting a sweatshirt program
- d) Department of History discussed its efforts to provide free books for students and the impact of funding cuts on students.

7) Action items

- a) The Chair presented a bill to allow the Finance Committee to operate during the summer and make decisions before the first council meeting.
- b) The bill passed with a roll call vote.
- c) The Chair presented a bill to increase the threshold limit for student organization budgets from \$1,000 to \$2,000.
- d) The bill passed with a sweeping motion and individual appropriations are discussed and approved
