

## **North Campus Liaison:**

Updated July, 2025

- Propose and advocate for initiatives that benefit graduate and professional students specifically on the North Campus of UNM (e.g., wellness services, infrastructure, parking, student support)
- Act as the primary representative for North Campus students within GPSA leadership and committees.
- Identify and communicate the diverse concerns, needs, and interests of students across the Health Sciences and Law School to GPSA.
- Establish and maintain effective communication channels with North Campus student organizations and departments.
- Disseminate information regarding GPSA programs, scholarships, events, and policy updates to North Campus constituents.
- Organize feedback sessions, surveys, or forums to solicit input from students.
- Collaborate with GPSA Directors, other Liaisons, and University departments to support student-centered programming.
- Contribute to discussions on graduate student funding, academic policies, and diversity and inclusion.
- Serve as a mediator and resource for students navigating administrative or academic challenges.
- Build coalitions across diverse student populations and perspectives.
- Provide an end of semester and annual written public report to the President
- Attend meetings as requested by the GPSA President or Chief of Staff
- Hold voting membership on the Executive Board (E-Board)
- Adhere to the Constitution and Bylaws in the execution of responsibilities, power and duties
- Serve a minimum of three (3) scheduled office hours each week in the GPSA Office
- Provide annual written public report to the President to be included in the annual report
- All other duties as reasonably requested by the President or as defined by the GPSA Constitution and Bylaws.

## **Qualifications:**

- Must be accepted and enrolled in a graduate or professional program on UNM's North Campus (e.g., Health Sciences, Law, nursing).
- Experience with student organizing, policy advocacy, or public speaking preferred, but not required
- Strong communication, interpersonal, and leadership skills
- Demonstrated interest in student governance, advocacy, or campus engagement.
- Ability to represent diverse communities and manage multiple priorities.
- Ability to work independently and complete tasks and meet deadlines, with limited supervision
- Conduct themselves in a manner that promotes public confidence in the integrity and impartiality of GPSA legislation and governance
